Advocacy and Legal Advice

Both UCOL Student Success staff and UCOL's Student Association (AS@U who is contracted by UCOL) provide advocacy support service to students needing assistance with academic grievances, income support issues, and many other issues related to their study at UCOL.

Career Information, Advice and Guidance

UCOL students are assisted with support into employment through the UCOL Employability Hub and a contracted service through AS@U. This includes employability workshops, CV development and career guides. Good working relationships with industry and agencies have already been developed and continue to be fostered.

Counselling Services and Pastoral Care

A counselling service is available on all campuses for students requiring immediate support. Further specialist counselling services is contracted by UCOL to specialist counsellors.

Employment Information

This service is undertaken by the Employability Hub and is developing within UCOL. Employment opportunities are advertised on each campus as well as interview opportunities with prospective employers. UCOL contracts AS@U to provide support to students through the Student Job Search programme.

Financial Support and Advice

Budgeting advice is freely available to students. Hardship situations are assessed and help may be provided with financial assistance and food parcels.

Health Services

Health services are provided to UCOL students through various healthcare providers at each campus.

Clubs and Societies

UCOL students can access clubs and societies offered through AS@U. A list of clubs and societies at UCOL are available through AS@U.

Sports, Recreation and Cultural Activities

AS@U facilitates a range of sporting activities for UCOL students including opportunities to join Massey University Students Association (MUSA) sports activities. UCOL and AS@U ensure that there are a number of student activities over orientation, including ongoing cultural and social events throughout the year.
